Total curriculum (180 EC)

Foundation (30 EC)

The six Foundation courses introduce you to the main academic disciplines in GRL and give you a basis to further choose your major.

Skills Lab (25 EC)

The courses in the Skills Lab provide you with tools in academic communication and research methodology, as well as intercultural competences and leadership skills.

Major (95 EC)

At the end of your first year, you select your major and determine your own path throughout the GRL programme. In addition, you complete one Living Lab research internship and conclude the degree with your Capstone.

Minor (30 EC)

The third-year minor allows you to personalize your degree even further by either broadening or deepening your programme. Spend a semester abroad, take specialized courses, or complete an internship!

Leadership

Leadership Labs

Your personal Leadership Lab is focused on self-discovery and self-development; by reflecting on your own skills and interests, you develop your own leadership style. Grow as a global citizen and as a professional in close collaboration with your fellow students and lecturers!

Living Lab projects

The Living Lab research internship is a unique opportunity to gain professional experience and tackle a real, practical challenge in collaboration with a partner organization. Take ownership of your project and develop solutions that can actually be implemented!

Capstone

For the Capstone, you write your bachelor thesis. It allows you to demonstrate your knowledge and skills, as well as your development as a personally and socially responsible student and citizen.


Explore how earth system science, environmental science, and the energy transition interact in addressing climate change and improving biodiversity and sustainability.

Global challenges - local solutions

Our programme is based on the UN Sustainable Development Goals and equips you to find local and regional solutions to worldwide issues, such as climate change, access to education, and gender inequality. Our students tend to be politically engaged and motivated to make changes in- and outside of their community.

Living Lab projects

The Living Lab research internship allows you to apply your knowledge and skills in the real world. You work together with stakeholders to provide recommendations to a real-world question, based on academic research. Previous Living Lab partners have been the Global Center on Climate Adaptation, the Municipality of Leeuwarden, Amnesty International, House of Design, and Groninger Voedseltuinen.
