### **Dutch High-Rises**




- increased demand for urban living
- regulation that prohibits cities to expand into rural areas


From the literature, it becomes clear that **high-rises often have negative effects on social cohesion** between residents.

"How can high-rises in the Netherlands be designed in a way that they lead to more interaction, social cohesion and less exclusionary?"








#### **Best Practices**
