# Section 1 General provisions

# Article 1.1 – Applicability of the Teaching and Examination Regulations

These Teaching and Examination Regulations comprise a Part A and a Part B. This degree programme-specific Part B complements Part A, which contains general provisions that apply to the teaching, examinations and final assessments of the Master's degree programmes provided by the Faculty of Arts, herein-after referred to as **the Faculty**. Part B contains stipulations that specifically concern the Master's degree programme in **Literary Studies**.

#### Section 2 Admission

# **Article 2.1 – Entry requirements**

- 1. Students with a Dutch or foreign certificate of higher education that indicates that they have knowledge and understanding of and subject-specific skills in Literary Studies at academic Bachelor's level will be admitted to the degree programme.
- 2. Holders of a certificate from a Bachelor's degree programme in Languages and Cultures of the University of Groningen or from another Dutch university are assumed to have the knowledge, understanding and skills listed in Article 4.2.1 and will be admitted to the degree programme on that basis.
- 3. If a candidate does not have a Bachelor's degree certificate, the Admissions Board must assess whether they can be admitted based on the possession of knowledge, understanding and skills at Bachelor's level.

# Article 2.2 - Language requirements for students with foreign qualifications

- 1. Students who have been admitted to a degree programme on the basis of a foreign certificate or degree may be asked by the Board of Examiners before registration to pass a Dutch or English language test, depending on the language of the chosen Master's track, to be administered by an agency stipulated by the Board.
- 2. The Dutch language proficiency requirement can be met by passing the State Examination in Dutch as a Second Language (NT2-II).
- 3. The following applies to the Master's specializations in *English Literature and Culture and Writing, Editing and Mediating:* The English language requirement can be met by presenting one of the following pieces of documentary evidence:
  - a. a Bachelor's degree certificate in English Language and Culture from a Dutch university
  - b. the internet-based TOEFL test (iBT TOEFL, minimum score 110, with a minimum score of 25 on all components)
  - c. IELTS, Academic Module, 8 (with a minimum score of 7.5 on all components)
  - d. a certificate from the University of Groningen Language Centre, at least CEFR C1 on all components.
- 4. The following applies to the Master's track in *European Literatures and Interculturality*:

  The English language requirement can be met by presenting one of the following pieces of documentary evidence:
  - a. a Bachelor's degree certificate in English Language and Culture from a Dutch university
  - b. the internet-based TOEFL test (iBT TOEFL, with a minimum score of 90 and a minimum score of 21 on all components)
  - c. IELTS, Academic Module, 6.5 (with a minimum score of 6.0 on all components)
  - d. a certificate from the University of Groningen Language Centre, at least CEFR B2 on all components.

The entry requirements for the various languages are as follows:

CEFR B2/C1 is required on all components for: French, Italian, Spanish, Swedish

CEFR C1 is required on all components for: German CEFR B1/B2 is required on all components for: Russian

## Article 2.3 Admission to the Master's tracks

In addition to the provisions of Article 2.1, the following admission requirements apply to the various tracks in this Master's degree programme:

## a) Master's track in English Literature and Culture

- 1. Students with a Dutch or foreign certificate of higher education that indicates that they have the knowledge and understanding of and subject-specific skills in English Literature and Culture at academic Bachelor's level, as well as sufficient proficiency in English in accordance with the language requirements set out in Article 2.2.3, will be admitted to the Master's track.
- 2. Holders of a certificate from the Bachelor's degree programme in English Language and Culture of the University of Groningen or from another Dutch university are expected to have the knowledge, understanding and skills listed in Article 2.3.1 and will be admitted to the track on that basis.

## b) Master's track in Writing, Editing and Mediating

- 1. Students with a Dutch or foreign certificate of higher education that indicates that they have the knowledge and understanding of and subject-specific skills in English Language and Culture at academic Bachelor's level, as well as sufficient proficiency in English in accordance with the language and literature requirements set out in Article 2.2.3, will be admitted to the Master's track.
- 2. Holders of a certificate from the Bachelor's degree programme in English Language and Culture of the University of Groningen or from another Dutch university are expected to have the knowledge, understanding and skills listed in Article 2.3.1 and will be admitted to the track on that basis.

## c) Master's track in European Literatures and Interculturality

- 1. Students with a Dutch or foreign certificate of higher education that indicates that they have knowledge and understanding of and subject-specific skills in the language, literature and culture of the relevant target language (German, French, Italian, Russian, Spanish, Frisian or Swedish) at academic Bachelor's level will be admitted to the Master's track.
- 2. Holders of a Bachelor's degree in ETC from the University of Groningen with a language endorsement or a Bachelor's degree in language and culture in one of the seven major languages included in the Bachelor's degree programme in ETC from another Dutch university are assumed to have the knowledge, understanding and skills listed in Article 2.3.1 and will be admitted to the track on that basis.

# Section 3 Content and structure of the degree programme

# **Article 3.1 – Student workload**

- 1. The student workload of the degree programme is 60 ECTS credits.
- 2. The student workload is expressed in whole ECTS credits.

## **Graduates of English Literature and Culture have**

- 15. Advanced knowledge and understanding of a range of English literary texts from different literary periods.
- 16. Knowledge and understanding of texts written in regional English, global English, or older forms of English (e.g. medieval English).
- 17. The ability to work with various types of English discourse (books, electronic media, lectures, films etc.), even when they are not clearly structured and when the relationships between ideas are only implied rather than stated explicitly.

- 18. Knowledge of the interaction between cultural, economic or technological factors and literature in English.
- 19. The ability to express themselves in clear, well-structured English at level C2.

# **Graduates of Writing, Editing and Mediating have**

- 19. The ability to express themselves in clear, well-structured English at level C2.
- 20. Knowledge and understanding of a range of theoretical and methodological debates related to the dissemination of texts (e.g. editing, electronic publication).
- 21. The ability to apply key methods and concepts relevant to advanced textual study.
- 22. The ability to examine and process English texts to ensure their appropriate dissemination (e.g. copy-editing) with due acknowledgement of cultural differences.
- 23. Knowledge of the interaction between cultural, economic or technological factors and textuality.

### **Graduates of European Literatures and Interculturality have**

- 24. Advanced knowledge of the role of processes of intercultural theory, change and transfer.
- 25. Advanced knowledge of the cultures and histories of the European continent in general, and of at least one region in particular.
- 26. The ability to read, interpret and compare texts from different genres and in different styles in their chosen language of expertise.
- 27. The ability to reflect on research about processes of cultural change and cultural transfer between different languages, cultures and literatures and their interaction.
- 28. The ability to express themselves orally and in written form at the required level in a variety of registers (formal, informal, specialist) in their chosen language of study or in either Dutch or English.

# **Article 3.3 – Language**

- 1. The degree programme is taught in *Dutch/English*.
- 2. The Master's tracks in English Literature and Culture and Writing, Editing and Mediating are taught in English. Students of these tracks must write their thesis in English.
- 3. Students of the Master's track in European Literatures and Interculturality may write their thesis in the target language or in Dutch or English.

Students who start the Master's degree programme in the second semester must follow at least two target languagespecific seminars in that semester, as well as two interdisciplinary seminars or another course unit from the Faculty's range or an English course unit from the national Masterlanguage programme. The following first semester of the new academic year will then comprise 10 ECTS in target language-specific seminars in the field of English literature as well as the compulsory thesis. Students can only follow a placement if they are willing to incur study delay, as the 20 ECTS in English Literature course units must be followed during two semesters and the thesis cannot be written until the second semester of the programme.

#### **Article 5.1 – Amendments**

- 2. Any amendments to Part B of these Regulations will, following a recommendation by and/or upon the approval of the Programme Committee and the Faculty Council, be confirmed by the Faculty Board in a separate decree.
- 3. Any amendments to these Regulations will not apply to the current academic year, unless it may reasonably be assumed that the amendment in question will not harm the interests of students.
- 4. In addition, an amendment may not influence any other decision concerning a student taken by the Board of Examiners under these Regulations to the disadvantage of students.

## **Article 5.2 - Publication**

- 1. The Faculty Board will duly publish these Regulations, the Rules and Regulations formulated by the Board of Examiners, and any amendments to these documents.
- 2. Copies of the documents referred to in Article 5.2.1 are available from the Faculty Office. These documents can also be found on the Faculty website through the Student Portal.

# **Article 5.3 – Date of commencement**

These Regulations will take effect on 1 September 2019.

These Regulations were decreed by the Board of the Faculty of Arts on 13 August 2019 and approved by the Faculty Council and the Programme Committee where required.
