Short Biography Prof.Dr. Oliver Remien

Prof. Dr. Oliver Remien is the holder of the Chair of Private Law, European Economic Law, Private International Law and Litigation as well as Comparative Law at the Faculty of Law of the Julius-Maximilians-Universität in Würzburg, Germany. There he also is the chairman of the Companion Study Program in European Law (Begleitstudium) since many years and serves as Dean of the Faculty since 2012. He studied at Hamburg and Geneva, received his Dr. iuris in Hamburg with his comparative and international procedural dissertation on astreinte/dwangsom/fine in order to induce performance/Zwangsgeld (Rechtsverwirklichung durch Zwangsgeld, Vergleich - Vereinheitlichung - Kollisionsrecht) and presented his Habilitationsschrift on Fundamental Freedoms of the EC-Treaty and Mandatory Contract Law (Grundfreiheiten des EG-Vertrages und zwingendes Vertragsrecht) in Hamburg. He once was an assistant and senior researcher at the Max-Planck Institute for Comparative and International Private Law in Hamburg and for a year assistant associé at the Institut de Droit Comparé de Paris in Paris and during many of those years was the Secretary of the first Commission on European Contract Law chaired by Ole Lando. He has published widely especially on questions of European Private Law, edited a number of books in that field and lectured at many universities.
