

Annex to the Teaching and Examination Regulations English-taught Master's degree programmes Law 2020-2021

Article 1 – Provisional admission

- 1. At the request of a candidate who is preparing for the final examination of the Bachelor's degree programme, the Admissions Board can decide to provisionally admit a student to the programme, provided:
 - s/he still has to complete a joint maximum course load of 15 ECTS of that Bachelor's degree programme.
 - s/he has successfully completed the bachelor-concluding course unit. The provisional admission will be repealed in case admission as stated in Art. 2.1 and 2.2 TER English-taught Master's degree programmes Law 2020-2021 has not been obtained within two adjacent semesters. The Master's degree cannot be conferred if the final examination of the Bachelor's degree programme has not been successfully completed.
- 2. At the request of a candidate who is registered in a pre-Master's programme at the Faculty of Law, the Admission Board can decide to provisionally admit a student to the Master's programme linked to the pre-Master's programme, provided the student only has to successfully complete a joint maximum course load of 15 ECTS of that pre-Master's programme. The Master's degree cannot be conferred if the full pre-Master's programme has not been successfully completed.
- 3. The provisional admission as arranged for in Art. 1.1 is only possible in the academic year 2020-2021. The regular entry moments apply.

Article 2 – Certified copies

- To gain admission as arranged for in Article 1, students must provide formal proof of their deficiency through certified copies of their Bachelor university.
- 2. Students registered in a bachelor or pre/Master)s programme at the Faculty of Law in Groningen can replace the certified copies mentioned in article 2.1 by an approved list of courses in Progress.
